City Council Holds First Reading of New Tax Ordinance

held Monday evening to discuss tax increases for the coming year.

A meeting was held Friday evening to discuss these tax increases.

However, there were not enough Council members present in order for the reading to take place. Four members are required, yet only three were present.

The council members not present were unable to attend due to health reasons or prior engagements.

Although there are some changes with tax rates, watercraft and automobile taxes will remain the same as the previous year.

The tax rate on real estate will increase to .195 for every \$100 spent. A motion was made to accept this increase by Eugene Hall. A second to the motion was made by Doug Garrett. The motion passed by a vote of 4 to 1.

After Ordinance 3 2012 was read, the first reading of this ordinance was passed by City Council. A motion to accept was made by Betty Jo Booth. A second to the motion was made by Tommy Crawford. The motion passed unanimously.

The taxes for the per-

sonal property within the city limits will increase to 0.45 per \$100 spent. A motion was made by Tommy Crawford to approve this new tax rate. A second to the motion was made by Betty Jo Booth. The first reading of this ordinance passed.

The taxes for motor vehicles will remain 0.35 for every \$100 spent. A motion to accept the terms of this ordinance was made by Betty Jo Booth. A second to the motion was made by Eugene Hall. The motion passed and this ordinance will take effect on January 1, 2013, should it pass the second reading.

These changes to taxes for individuals living within the Carlisle city will generate an income of \$4,874.36 for the City of Carlisle.

Due to the necessity of

this ordinance requiring two readings before October 1, a second reading of this ordinance will take place on Tuesday, September 25 at 7 p.m. at the Carlisle City Office.

A motion was made by Eugene Hall to adjourn the meeting. A second to the motion was made by John Jones. The motion passed and the meeting was adjourned.

"This year's tax increase is only a penny over last year's tax rate," said Michelle McDonald, Nicholas County's Property Valuation Administrator. "The tax rate averages out to approximately two dollars for every \$50,000 of worth. The revenue that this tax increase will go into the budget of the City of Carlisle to fund community projects."

Carlisle City Fire Department Purchases New Equipment Tray

The Carlisle City Fire Department has purchased an equipment tray for their fire van, which is used to house and transport the equipment that the fire department needs when they respond to fires and other emergencies.

The tray, a Bedside 1000, is used to make the firefighters' equipment more accessible when they are responding to emergencies. The tray holds their coats, helmets, pants, oxygen tanks and other equipment that they may need.

To purchase these trays, the fire department used money that they raised at the Blackberry Festival. The cost of this piece of equipment was approximately \$900.

"We run the fire department on a very tight budget," says Fire Chief Jim Biddle. "But we set up booths at the Blackberry Festival and Saturday in Car-

lisle every year to raise money to buy things that will make our jobs easier."

The tray is a very advanced piece of equipment with four locking mechanisms. These are meant to prevent the tray slid-

ing all the way out, which could result in damages or even injury.

"This tray will make our job much easier," said City Fire Fighter, Adam Tubbs. "This will make accessing our equipment much easier and more efficient."

Fiscal Court Discusses Animal Advisory Board's Policies and Procedures

Concern for the care and safety of animals was discussed at the recent meeting of the Nicholas County Fiscal Court last Friday Morning.

There was a discussion at the meeting regarding the matter of Nicholas County's Animal Advisory Board's Policies and Procedures.

One of the most discussed aspects of the document was the matter of the animal shelter taking in stray animals. According to the drafted procedures, the animal shelter is currently mandated to accept drop-offs.

Magistrate Jeff Randolph appeared somewhat concerned about certain aspects of the policies; especially an aspect of the policies would make pick up of animals voluntary.

"I really don't want to open up a can of worms on this one," said Randolph. "We can't just run around the county picking up every dog someone gets tired of."

It was mentioned that a fee for animal drop-off would be very beneficial to cutting down the amount of excessive drop-offs.

"I think this is a great way to cut down on strays

wandering the county," said County Attorney, Dawn Letcher. "But I do think that it will be very difficult to enforce."

Willie Hogg, the Nicholas County Animal Control Officer, stated that the facilities in which the animals are being kept is in very clean condition. Hogg also stated that there are many steps that have to be taken before an animal can be adopted, including spay and neutering.

There was some concern over the matter of euthanasia and some of the animals that are recovered. It was stressed by members of the Animal Welfare Society that euthanasia is only acceptable in emergency situations and is not taken lightly. But it was also stressed that the first priority is human safety if an animal is exceptionally aggressive.

A motion was made that the procedures of the Animal Advisory Board would be adopted, pending review by County Attorney, Dawn Letcher. The motion was made by Darvin Mitchell. A second to the motion was made by Jimmy Wells. The motion was passed.

Next, the members of the Fiscal Court held a second reading of the 2012 tax ordinance. A motion was made by Jeff Randolph to approve the second reading of the 2012 tax ordinance. A second to the motion was made by Mike Webb. The motion was passed.

There was also a discussion regarding the speed limits on rural roads within the county. In order to post speed limits on rural roads, they have to be passed by an ordinance. To make citizens aware of the speed limits, signs will have to be posted on the roads. It was stressed that people could take advantage if the speed limits are not posted and advertised. In order to determine proper speed limits, Nicholas County Judge-Executive Kenny Lyons said that it would be possible to get an official from the University of Kentucky to come down and determine recommendations of the road conditions, so they can be approved by the Fiscal Court.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Jimmy Wells. A second to the motion was made by Jeff Randolph. The meeting was adjourned.

Heaven Is A Lot Like Kentucky

Eighteen hundred and sixty-one: There in the echo of Sumter's gun Marches the host of the Orphan Brigade, Lit by their banners, in hope's best arrayed. Five thousand strong, never legion hath borne Might as this bears it forth in that morn:

Hastings and Cre- cy, Naseby, Dunbar, Cowpens and Yorktown, Thousand Years' War, Is writ on their hearts as onward afar They shout to the roar of their drums.

Eighteen hundred and sixty-two: Well have they paid to the earth its due. Close up, steady! The half are yet here And all of the might, for the living bear The dead in their hearts over Shiloh's field - Rich, O God, is thy harvest's yield! Where faith swings the sickle, trust binds the sheaves, To the roll of the surging drums.

Eighteen hundred and sixty-three: Barring Sherman's march to the sea - Shorn to a thousand; face to the foe Back, ever back, but stubborn and slow. Nineteen hundred wounds they take In that service of Hell, yet the hills they shake With the roar of their charge as onward they go To the roar of their throbbing drums.

Eighteen hundred and sixty-four: Their banners are tattered, and scarce twelve score, Battered and wearied and seared and old,

Stay by the staves where the Orphans hold Firm as a rock when the surges break - Shield of a land where men die for His sake, For the sake of the brothers whom they have laid low, To the roll of their muffled drums.

Eighteen hundred and sixty-five: The Devil is dead and the Lord is alive, In the earth that springs where the heroes sleep, and in love new born where the stricken weep. That legion hath marched past the setting of sun: Beaten? Nay, victors: the realms they have won are the hearts of men who forever shall hear the throb of their far-off drums.

THE ORPHAN BRIGADE: A poem written by Prof. N. S. Shaler of the Union Army, immediately following the American Civil War.

"The man at my elbow on each side of me was killed...I offered up a prayer that the Lord would guide me and strengthen me and that when death came to me it would find me gallantly doing my duty, that my first desire should not be that I escape death, but that my death should help the cause of right to triumph."

From the diary of Confederate soldier Johnny Green, a member of the Kentucky First Infantry Brigade, the Orphan Brigade; on his thoughts as he charged the Union defensive line at Chickamauga in northern Georgia Sept. 19, 1863.

THE ROCK OF CHICKAMAUGA

Green was shot in the groin on a final charge at Chickamauga and thought his leg was blown off. A Union Minnie ball had struck and splintered his rifle and the ball then sank into a metal clasp, which closed his pocket notebook together, which was in his pants' pocket. Green was wounded several times, but managed, miraculously to survive the war. His diary continues to be a treasured eyewitness account of life among the soldiers of the Orphan Brigade.

Sept. 20, 1863

4th Regiment Confederate junior officer, Lieutenant Lott Dudley Young (most often called L.D. Young), steadied himself for the grim sights that lay before him. The Nicholas County native was no stranger to death and destruction and though he had attributed his survival in this great War of Northern Aggression thus far in the conflict, his fellow soldiers of the 4th Regiment of the 1st Kentucky Infantry Brigade, The Orphan Brigade, knew him to be one of the most intelligent and professional soldiers among them. His comrades in Company H, particularly Robert Lindsey, the unit's color bearer, were drawn to him for his keen wit and physical endurance.

He helped lead them to victory the

day before at what would be known as The Battle of Chickamauga.

They had charged straight into the defense works held by the old Union veterans of General George Henry "Pap" Thomas and though they eventually did break through, it came at a terrible cost and as the day of battle drew to a close, Pap Thomas had held his ground longer than any of the other Union Officers. LD couldn't help but curse their own Army's commander, General Braxton Bragg. He had not acted when his army broke through the union lines but had ordered a halt and though the battle would be considered a great Confederate victory, it could have been so much more. Instead they had been ordered to retreat to a defensive position at a place called Missionary Ridge.

Pap Thomas held out with his men at a place called Horsehoe Ridge, Bragg having missed the opportunity to annihilate the Union force, as the rest of the entire union line, which consisted of 60,000 men had been routed from the field.

LD received permission to inspect seven miles along the battlefield, where so much carnage had been rendered only a short time before.

"I witnessed the most appalling sight my eyes ever be-

held, a description of which I shudder and shrink at this distant day... all the upturned faces and glaring eyes, torn and mangled bodies of not less than four thousand dead men on the field and at the hospitals. There were acres covered with dead and wounded," LD Young would write 53 years later upon his visit to the battlefield and the memory he could not shake.

The loss of the leader of the Orphan Brigade, General Benjamin Hardin Helms, had filled their hearts with sorrow.

"I really believe he was one of the kindest-hearted and best men I ever knew," Young would write of Helms.

General Helms was killed by a sharpshooter among the Union's 15 Kentucky Infantry. The battle, like most throughout the war, pitted Kentuckians against Kentuckians.

Helms, was strangely a brother-in-law of President Abraham Lincoln, having married Emilie Todd, the

sister of Mary Todd Lincoln.

President Lincoln and Mary went into deep mourning within the Whitehouse and faced staunch criticism that same December when they accepted Emilie Todd Helms into the Whitehouse where they grieved together.

Future president James Garfield, a field officer for the Union Army of the Cumberland, visited Pap Thomas during the battle, carrying orders from Union General William Rosecrans to retreat; when Thomas said he would have to stay behind to ensure the Union Army's safety and defended Horseshoe Ridge. Garfield told Rosecrans that Thomas was "standing like a rock."

From that day forth Pap Thomas was known to veterans on both sides as "The Rock of Chickamauga".

Dead, wounded, missing and captured, numbered a total of 34,624 men at The Battle of Chickamauga.

Secretary Grimes Reports Absentee Ballots Are on Their Way to Military Voters

The November 6, 2012, General Election is only six weeks away, and Secretary of State Alison Lundergan Grimes reports that Kentucky's county clerks started sending absentee ballots to military and other eligible voters last week.

"The process of receiving, filling out, and returning an absentee ballot can take weeks, especially for active-duty military members," said Grimes. "I encourage all eligible citizens to make sure they are registered to vote and submit their absentee ballot requests promptly."

Kentuckians can check their registration status, obtain a voter registration card and review information related to the upcoming General Election at the Secretary of State's website, www.sos.ky.gov. Resources for military and overseas U.S. citizens are also located on the Secretary of State's website. In an effort to reach all eligible voters, direct links to these items are highlighted on the Secretary of State's Facebook page. Members of the military and their families and overseas U.S. citizens can find additional information on registering to vote and requesting an absentee ballot via the Federal Post Card Application by visiting www.fvap.gov.

Grimes, who recently

returned from a trip to the Middle East to assess and improve military voting, said, "Many of the men and women in uniform I had the privilege to meet during my trip to the Middle East sought reassurance that their ballots are actually counted. As the Commonwealth's Chief Election Official, removing these doubts and ensuring that our troops have the opportunity to have their voices heard is a priority."

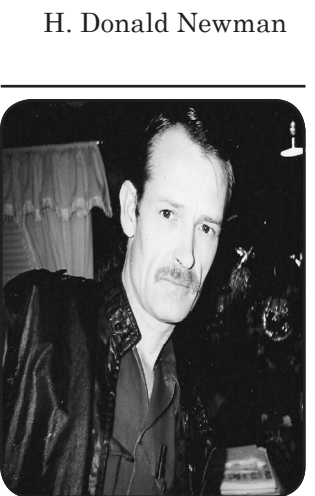
Under Kentucky law, ballots for the November 6th General Election were required to be printed at least 50 days before the election, or September 17, 2012. Absentee ballots that were validly requested prior to that date were required to be transmitted no later than three days thereafter, or September 20, 2012. Absentee ballots validly requested after September 17th will be transmitted within three days after the application is received.

For all voters, the deadline to register to vote is October 9, 2012, and the deadline to apply for a mail-in absentee ballot is October 30, 2012. In order to be counted, executed absentee ballots must be received by the county clerk no later than 6 p.m., local time, on November 6, 2012. In-person absentee voting will be open in all counties at least 12 business days before the election.

Nicholas County will return to the gridiron on Friday night. Following an off week, Nicholas County is set to host non-district foe Ludlow.

Nicholas County is 4-1 through its first five games. The Jackets have scored 180 points through five games and rank among the state's Top 10 Class A teams.

Nicholas County, under the guidance of head coach Robert Hopkins, owns wins over non-district rivals Lewis County, West Carter, Berea and Paris. After doubling up Lewis County 32-16 in Week 0, Nicholas County fell to Fleming County.

Nicholas County has additional regular-season games remaining with Raceland (Oct. 5, home), Paintsville (Oct. 12, away), Fairview (Oct. 19, home) and Bath County (Oct. 26, away).

The Jackets are averaging over 300 yards per game. Austin Allison, JD Wagoner, Zack Howard and new quarterback Ben Duncan lead the Nicholas County offense.

Ludlow is 1-4 following a loss to Newport last week. Five opponents have outscored Ludlow 199-84.

Struggling offensively, Ludlow has compiled less than 1,000 yards in

five games. Ludlow has rushed for 470 yards. The Panthers have passed for 471 yards through their first five games.

Anthony Jordan and Kolin McCauley lead the Ludlow rushing attack. Jordan and McCauley have combined to rush for 292 yards via 71 carries.

Quarterback Cody Mitchell has rushed for 54 yards and a team-high two touchdowns.

Mitchell has completed 26-of-82 pass attempts for 479 yards and six touchdowns while

throwing six interceptions.

Tyler Hembree (20 tackles) leads the Ludlow defense.

Ludlow has been held to eight points or less in each of its last three games, all losses. The Panthers defeated Pendleton County 48-37 for their lone win to date. Ludlow has dropped games to Gallatin County, Carroll County and Bethlehem.

After hosting Ludlow, Nicholas County will compete in the district portion of its schedule. The Jackets will host

Raceland on Oct. 5, visit Paintsville Oct. 12 and entertain Fairview Oct. 19. Defending champion Fairview is favored to win another Class A, District 7 title.

Nicholas County Hosts American Legion Horse Show

People from several counties gathered last Saturday at the West End Ball Park for a horse show, presented by American Legion Post # 17 in Carlisle. There were several events for the competitors throughout the evening, including many crown favorites.

Contestants in the competitive events were judged on performance and style, while contestants in races were judged on their ability to complete the race in the quickest possible time.

The first event of the evening was a presentation of the Stick Horse class, in which several young people ride stick horses around the ring and compete for ribbons. Pleasure Mares was the next event of the evening. Of the eight competitors in this event, Michael Eldridge, riding his horse Hannah Montana, took first place and walked away with a blue ribbon.

The next event of the evening was the Baby Bottle race. A crowd favorite, the Baby Bottle race requires riders to carry a passenger behind them on the horse. The rider must then hold the bottle behind them, while their passenger drinks from the bottle. The first pair to finish the bottle is declared the winner. Candice Zornes, riding her horse Big Bopper, took first place in this event.

The next event of the evening was the Spotted Saddle Horses class. This event is for riders 17 and under only. Again, Candice Zornes, riding Big Bopper, took first place in this class.

The next event of the evening was the Men's Country Pleasure Horses class. Of the 11 entrants to this class, Mike Berry, riding Moonshine, took first place in this class.

The next event was the Penny Race, another crowd favorite. In this

event, competitors must take a penny and ride with a penny in their hand and drop it into a bucket located at the opposite end of the track and ride back. The competitor to complete the task with the quickest time is declared the winner. Pam King, riding Joe, took first place in this class.

The next event of the evening was the Pleasure Gelding class. There were 14 total entries in this class. First place in class was awarded to Gina Walker, riding her horse Make Mine on Ice.

The next event of the evening was the Spotted Saddle Horse class for competitors 18 and over. First place in this event was awarded to Tiffany Hensley, riding her horse JJ.

The next event was the Nicholas County Pleasure Horses class. This event was for riders 11 and under and had but one entry. First place was awarded to Jasmine Jones, riding her horse Flash.

The next event of the evening was the Woman's Country Pleasure class. Of the 11 competitors in this class, Gena Walker, riding her horse Make Mine on Ice, was awarded first place once again.

The next class of the evening to compete was the Ride a Buck class. Makayla Watkins, riding

her horse Cloud Dancing was awarded first place, her second blue ribbon of the evening.

The next class to compete was the Speed Racking class. Wayne Tapp, riding Farley, was awarded first place in this event.

Another crowd pleaser, this class requires the rider of each horse to ride to the opposite end of the track and retrieve a predetermined page from a catalog and return to the starting point. The next event of the evening was the Nicholas County Pleasure Horses class. This event was open only to riders ages 12 to 17. Riders were also required to be Nicholas County residents. First place for this event was awarded to Candice Zornes, riding her horse Big Bopper.

The next event of the evening was the Spotted Pleasure Horses class. First place for this event was again awarded to Candice Zornes. This was Candice's fourth blue ribbon for the evening.

The evening's next event was the Western Pleasure Horses class. Contestants were required to walk, trot and lope their horses around the track while judges would determine their performance. First place in this event was awarded to Emily Sapp, riding her horse Star.

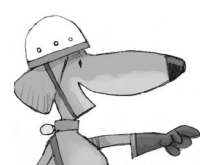

You're looking at her, she said with a gorgeous smile. Sam is short for Samantha. And since you're wondering, I'm as strong as any man, she said, winking at me. Hop in your car and follow me. Hey, gang, Sam said in a chipper voice when we arrived at our destination. Welcome to Red River

Gorge. Most of the gorge is located inside Daniel Boone National Forest and has been designated a National Natural Landmark.

County recieves road money

Robertson County received a check for \$200,000 for road repairs at the recent meeting of the Robertson County Fiscal Court on Wednesday morning.

Fiscal Court discussed the matter of a Bridge Agreement Resolution. This resolution would allow five bridges within the county to come into possession of the county. This would allow them to make necessary repairs, so as to make travel much easier. Ricky Myers made a motion to allow Judge-Executive Allison to sign the resolution. Troy Martin made a second to the motion. The motion passed.

Approval to accept a Rural Secondary Road Agreement was also discussed in the meeting. The agreement would bring possession of the all roads contained within the county to become property of the county. A motion to accept the resolution was made by Dee Whitaker. A second to the motion was made by Terry Craecraft. The motion was passed.

The establishment of the county tax rate was also discussed by the Fiscal Court. It was determined by the members of the court to have the tax rates remain the same as last year's tax rate. A motion to keep all special district tax rates was made by Troy Martin. A second to the motion was
